

STUDENT EXCHANGE APPENDIX
to the
AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION
between
THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK
and
COPENHAGEN BUSINESS SCHOOL

In accordance with Section II of the Agreement of Cooperation, the following mechanisms designed to encourage and facilitate exchange of students are hereby established:

1. Students are to be exchanged for one full academic year or for one semester. With the consent of CBS , Stony Brook may nominate students to participate in a summer program at CBS. The program will provide sufficient contact hours to earn at least 6 Stony Brook credit. If CBS provides the program at no cost to Stony Brook students, then in return, Stony Brook will accept 1 semester student from CBS per every 2 Stony Brook students who participate in the Summer Program, or some combination of student sand semester's equivalent to this.
2. The number of students to be exchanged each year will be determined by mutual consent no later than February 1, of the preceding academic year. CBS and Stony Brook also agree to achieve full reciprocity for this Student exchange Agreement, by the end of this agreement period. This balance may be achieved by an exchange of an equal number of students or other academic exchanges.
3. Initial selection of students will take place at the home institution; however, the host institution reserves the right to deny admission to any students not meeting its general admission criteria.
4. Students dossiers should be received at the host institutions no later than March 15 for fall admissions and October 15 spring admissions.
5. Each host university will assist incoming students in arranging accommodation. Students will be responsible for their own housing costs.
6. The host university will waive tuition charges for the incoming exchange students and will inform them in timely fashion concerning fees and expenses for which the student will be responsible.
7. Exchange students will be required to enroll in the mandatory SUNY insurance program and be responsible for any deductible costs related to health care services.
8. Students must be enrolled in a full-time course load at the host university for the duration of the program and in accordance with the student's degree program.
9. Students will free to choose courses form the full range of courses available at the host university,
