

AGREEMENT OF BACHELORS AND MASTERS DEGREE COLLABORATION
BETWEEN
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK
STONY BROOK, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
AND
HENAN UNIVERSITY
HENAN, CHINA

In recognition of the importance of international education and particularly the long standing ties of mutual cooperation, State University of New York at Stony Brook, United States of America (hereafter SBU) and Henan University, People's Republic of China (hereafter HENU) agree to develop and administer a cooperative two-degree program for undergraduate students initially admitted to HENU. The Program is specifically designed to enable qualified participants from HENU, as determined by both universities, to enter Bachelors and Master's Degree Collaboration(hereafter Program)after three years of undergraduate course work at HENU. Students in the Programwill earn a bachelor's degree from HENU and a master's degree from SBU upon successful completion of the respective requirements for each program.

Nominations

Each academic year HENU may nominate students with upper division standing to be considered for admission into the Program. Students in this program will be expected to complete three years at HENU prior to coming to SBU. Supporting documentation of nominations including credentials, complete academic records, a student personal statement, letters of recommendation, and any other additional requirements will be made available to SBU's Admissions by January 31 for fall enrollment and September 15 for spring enrollment. After the first year of the Program, students are required to receive a bachelor's degree from HENU.

Requirements

Nominated HENU students are required to have a GPA equivalent to an SBU 3.0 or higher and a minimal TOEFL score of 80 on the internet based test. Students must have completed all pre-requisites as designated by the Program. An onsite or online interview may be required of applicants to the Program.

Admission

Admission to the Program is open to all, regardless of undergraduate major. The nomination of HENU and documentation of minimal requirements will not in themselves guarantee admission to the Program. Admission offers for HENU nominees will be made by SBU, April 1 for the fall term and December 15 for

the spring term. Students must receive an offer letter from the SBU Graduate Program Director of the respective program prior to their first semester as a graduate student.

Transcripts

HENU will provide SBU with documentation that participating students have been awarded their bachelor's degree after their first year of the Program. A master's degree will not be awarded without this documentation.

Requirements for Graduation

Students in the Program will earn a bachelor's degree from HENU and a master's degree from SBU upon successful completion of the respective requirements for each program.

Tuition Costs and Fees

Admitted HENU students will pay tuition costs and fees for their bachelor's degree according to the rules of HENU. Admitted HENU students will pay the same prevailing out-of-state tuition and fees as other international students, directly to SBU's Bursar's Office.

Housing and Meal Plan

HENU students may apply for SBU housing and participate in the student meal plan.

Visas

SBU Visa and Immigration Services will provide the necessary assistance for HENU students to apply for an appropriate U.S. visa.


Duration and Termination of Agreement
