

STUDENT EXCHANGE APPENDIX
to the
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK, USA
and
SOUTH CHINA NORMAL UNIVERSITY, CHINA

In accordance with Section II of the Memorandum of Understanding between the State University of New York at Stony Brook, hereinafter SBU, and South China Normal University, hereinafter SCNU, the following mechanisms designed to encourage and facilitate the exchange of students are hereby established:


1. Students are to be exchanged for one full academic year or for one semester.
2. The number of students to be exchanged each year shall be determined by mutual consent no later than February 1 of the preceding academic year. SBU and SCNU agree to achieve for full reciprocity of the student exchange within three years. This balance may be achieved by an exchange of an equal number of students or other academic exchanges.
3. SBU and SCNU agree to the following conditions with SBU's Global Summer Institute:
 - I) SCNU agrees to utilize SBU's Global Summer Institute as one of its primary providers of international summer school.
 - II) SBU agrees to prioritize applications from SCNU.
 - III) Students enrolled in the Global Summer Institute will be subject to all of the exchange conditions listed within this Appendix with the exception of tuition waivers.
 - IV) SBU agrees to send SCNU updated program details on the Global Summer Institute including costs and schedules on an annual basis.
4. Initial selection of students will take place at the home institution; however, the host institution reserves the right to deny admission to any student not meeting its general admission criteria.
5. Student dossiers should be received at the host institution no later than March 15 for fall admissions, October 15 for spring admissions, and May 1 for SBU's Global Summer Institute.
6. Each host university shall assist incoming students in arranging accommodation.
7. Admitted students shall be responsible for tuition, orientation, housing and meal costs unless included in the participating program. Where reciprocity exists, the host university shall waive tuition costs for incoming students. The host university shall provide students with an invoice and receipt for their payments.
8. Exchange students shall be required to enroll in the mandatory health insurance program of the host

university and shall be responsible for all deductible costs related to health care services.

9. Students must be enrolled in a full-time course load at the host university for the duration of the program and in accordance with the student's degree program.
10. Students shall be free to choose courses from the full range of courses available at the host university, provided they satisfy course prerequisites and if required, departmental consent.
11. Students shall comply with all rules and regulations of the host university, including relevant academic standing and conduct requirements.
12. Students who participate in the exchange program will not be degree-seeking at the host university.
13. On the request of the student, at the end of a student's program overseas, the host university shall send to the home institution an official record of coursework completed at the host university.
14. Each university shall assess the academic work completed at the other university and shall award credit to its students in accordance with its own academic policies and regulations. Neither university shall be liable for the acts of the other or for the acts of students participating in the program.
15. The host university shall assist incoming students to obtain visas and other documents required for entry to the host country. To comply with host country regulations, exchange students shall be required to provide a guarantee that they have financial resources sufficient to meet all expenses.
16. This Appendix shall be in effect for the same period as the Memorandum of Understanding and may be adjusted in writing upon mutual agreement of the two parties. For matters not covered in Appendix x, the universities shall consult their Memorandum of Understanding.


