

APPENDIX, DUAL DEGREE PROGRAM
to the
AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION
between the
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
and
AFEKA-TEL AVIV ACADEMIC COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING
ISRAEL

In accordance with Section II of the Agreement of Cooperation by and between the State University of New York at Stony Brook ("Stony Brook") and AFEKA-Tel Aviv Academic College of Engineering ("AFEKA"), this Appendix establishes the terms and conditions of graduate student exchanges.

1. Students from AFEKA may enroll at SBU for graduate studies in the College of Engineering and Applied Sciences ("CEAS") at SBU.
2. Students shall be selected to participate in this program by AFEKA. SBU reserves the right to deny admission to any student not meeting its general admissions criteria and TOEFL score of better than 550 on the paper-based test, or better than 213 on the computer-based test. AFEKA students will be exempted from GRE exams.
3. The dossiers of selected students will be sent to Stony Brook's Office of International Academic Programs no later than February 1 for admission to SBU the following fall. Notification of action taken on such applications will be given to AFEKA officials no later than March 15. For the Spring semester, dossiers will be sent by October 1, with notification of action by November 15.
4. Payment of tuition and academic fees shall be made in accordance with standard policies of SBU. Charges for special classes, courses, and other goods, services, and activities not otherwise levied on regularly enrolled students shall be billed directly to AFEKA students in accordance with standard policies and procedures of SBU, which alone shall be responsible for their collection.
5. SBU shall take all reasonable steps to provide incoming students with on-campus housing in residence halls generally available to its regularly enrolled students. AFEKA students will be billed for such housing and board plans at the same rate charged regularly enrolled SBU students, and will be solely responsible for paying such charges in accordance with standard policies and procedures at SBU.
6. SBU shall help admitted AFEKA students to obtain visas and other documents required by current host country entry and visa requirements. Admitted students remain responsible, at all times, for maintaining appropriate immigrant status. AFEKA students are required to enroll in the mandatory insurance program of the State University of New York, and shall comply with Stony Brook's academic standing and conduct requirements. Neither AFEKA

nor SBU shall be responsible for the acts of the other, or for the acts of any student participating in this program.

7. AFEKA students are eligible for an SBU degree. Of the thirty (30) credit points required by CEAS for a Masters of Science degree, six (6) credit points of courses must be completed at AFEKA.
8. Stony Brook and AFEKA will cooperate to promote outside scholarships.

10. This Appendix shall be in effect for the same period as the Agreement of Cooperation and may be amended in writing upon mutual agreement of the two universities. Matters addressed in this Appendix are subject to the general provisions of the Agreement of Cooperation.
