

A GRADUATE DUAL DEGREE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
AJOU UNIVERSITY, KOREA
AND
THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK, U.S.A.

In recognition of the general importance of international education and particular long standing ties of mutual cooperation and respect, the State University of New York at Stony Brook (hereafter SBU) and Ajou University (hereafter AU) agree to develop and administer a dual degree program for graduate students of both SBU and AU. The program is specially designed to enable qualified participants, as determined by both universities, to qualify for a doctoral degree from both universities. The two parties can make separate appendixes for details about the implementation of this agreement.

1. Cooperation Coordinator

Each party will appoint an officer who will be responsible for the coordination and administration of the cooperation outlined in this agreement.

2. Nominations

Both universities shall nominate students with upper department standing per academic year for advanced standing at both universities for study in agreed upon upper department courses.

3. Requirements

Details of nomination requirements shall be specified in a separate appendix.

4. Admission

Nominations including a completed Dual Degree application, complete academic records and all other supporting material shall be made available to a host university by May 15 for the fall semester and October 15 for the spring semester. Nominations and documentation of minimal requirements do not in themselves guarantee admission. Offers of admission shall be made in accordance with existing standards and guidelines of each university.

5. Registration

Admitted students shall be registered for at least two semesters at each university for a doctoral degree and three semesters for a master's and doctoral combined degree.

6. Tuition Costs, Fees and Living Expenses

Admitted students shall pay tuition and fees directly to a host university. Admitted students shall also be responsible for the cost of his or her own housing, meals, transport and other expenses during the period of his or her stay at the host university. Each party shall inform the counterpart institution of the estimated costs and any changes in the tuition and housing cost, and all other fees in advance.

7. Insurance

Each participant shall provide his or her own health and accident insurance and be responsible for any costs related to health care services. Where necessary, proof of adequate insurance coverage must be provided to a host university before registering for courses.

8. Dependents

The obligations of each institution under this agreement are limited to the Dual Degree students and do not extend to partners or dependants. Expenses of accompanying partners and dependents are the responsibility of the student.

9. Graduation Requirements

In order to receive a degree from both universities, students must satisfactorily complete all graduation requirements of each university.

10. Visa

Each party shall assist admitted students to obtain an appropriate visa to enter and stay at a host country although the participants shall be required to complete visa applications and processes and meet any visa requirements that pertain to studying in the host country. Admitted students shall be responsible for maintaining appropriate immigration status.

11. Revisions, Duration and Termination of Agreement

This agreement shall be in effect for five years from the date of its signing. This agreement may be amended during the five years or extended by mutual consent of both parties. Either party may terminate this agreement by serving written notice to the other party. Termination will take effect six months from the date of the written notice. In the event of termination, all commitments to participating students shall be honored.

12. Further detailed negotiation with the Graduate School will be conducted before the actual implementation of this Dual Degree program.






