

Memorandum of Understanding
Between
The Ubiquitous Convergence Research Institute
Ajou University
And
The Center of Excellence in Wireless and Information Technology
The State University of New York at Stony Brook
For Collaboration in the Field of Information and Communication Technologies

The Ubiquitous Convergence Research Institute of Ajou University and The Center of Excellence in Wireless and Information Technology of The State University of New York at Stony Brook, hereinafter collectively referred to as the Parties, agree as follows:

1. The Parties agree to cooperate on the study of information and communication technologies (ICT) and related technologies by exchanging scientists and information, holding workshops, and conducting joint research projects with the aim of aiding research with each other and establishing friendly relationship.
2. The Parties shall promote and develop cooperation in mutually interested fields based on the principle of equal rights and mutual advantages.
3. The Parties in principle encourage activities in all fields of endeavors that strengthen mutual cooperation on technology management and long-term cooperative research.
4. The Parties shall cooperate with each other whenever requested with regard to the following items:
 - A. Exchanges of information
 - B. Exchanges of researchers
 - C. Promotion of joint research
 - D. Public relation
 - E. Joint organization of workshops
 - F. Other works related to the above items

5. During the term of this MOU, the Parties will agree to determine the respective shares of the ownership in each research project before a patent application or a publication. The Parties shall share in the expenses of protecting the intellectual property in accordance with the respective shares of the ownership. Any revenue generated from licensing or sub-licensing shall be shared in accordance with the respective shares of the ownership.
6. This agreement is valid upon the date it is signed by the duly authorized representatives of both parties and will remain valid for three (3) years. This Memorandum of Understanding may be terminated three (3) months after a notification has been given in writing of such intention by one party to the other.

Two (2) duplicate copies of this MOU shall be made, one for each party's record.


