## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING A PROPOSED PROGRAM BETWEEN THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK AND CHEJU HALLA COLLEGE, JEJU-DO, KOREA

This Memorandum of Understanding outlines the principal terms to be considered for a future agreement to be entered into by the State University of New York at Stony Brook (hereinafter denominated SUNY-Stony Brook), in New York, USA and Cheju Halla College (hereinafter denominated CHC), located in Jeju-Do, Korea.

### Objectives of the Agreement

#### I.

The purpose of this agreement is to memorialize the future goals of both parties to promote mutual exchange and cooperation between SUNY-Stony Brook and CHC in the areas of emergency medicine. This Memorandum of Understanding describes the intent between the parties upon which an agreement in the future will be based; and which further agreement will create a collaborative program arrangement between the SUNY-Stony Brook and CHC. Under the future agreement, SUNY-Stony Brook and CHC will cooperate to develop and offer short programs in emergency medicine through the Emergency Medicine Education Center "EMEC" (Cheju Halla / Stony Brook Emergency Medicine Education Center). "EMEC" is going to be established on the CHC campus in Korea and may lead to a SUNY-Stony Brook certificate.

This Memorandum of Understanding and any future agreements which may flow from this understanding are contingent upon each party complying with necessary immigration, licensure and insurance requirements as well as compliance with all Federal, State and local laws, rules and all applicable health and hospital regulations.

### Establishment of "EMEC" and Other Collaborative Programs Arrangement

#### II.

The following constitutes the present intent to engage in serious discussion and to reach an agreement in the future.

SUNY-Stony Brook and CHC will cooperate to the extent provided by law and consistent with all applicable SUNY policies, procedures and processes to promote extensive exchange in the following ways:

1. Establish CHC / SUNY-Stony Brook Emergency Medicine Education Center at CHC to run cooperative programs in Emergency Medicine.
2. "EMEC" will be established in April, 2006 on the CHC campus in Jeju City, Jeju-Do, Korea. It will open when both parties mutually accept the terms and sign the Agreement in Jeju.

3. "EMEC" will be established at the expense of CHC. CHC will own "EMEC" and will be responsible for the basic management. Both parties will discuss the building of the facilities, the operational rules and organization of "EMEC".
4. The SUNY-Stony Brook and CHC will cooperate in developing and operating short programs in Emergency Medicine.
5. Short Programs in "EMEC"
  - a. BLS Program (Provider, Instructor, Faculty)
  - b. ACLS Program (Provider, Instructor, Faculty)
  - c. EMT Program (EM-B, EMT-I)
  - d. EMT Paramedic Program
6. These Short programs will be run by mutual consent, and concrete plans on operating "EMEC" will be treated in a future agreement.

#### **Other Collaborative Programs**

7. Both parties will cooperate to make recommendations for an advanced Emergency Medical System "EMS" and endeavor to study and develop policies for a Healthcare System which Jeju Province, a free international city, has identified that it needs.
8. SUNY-Stony Brook, where requested and feasible under future agreements, expects to provide advice and cooperation with CHC, on government-supported expert training programs for Jeju "EMS" and Healthcare System.


#### **III.**




