



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between
THE SCHOOL OF NURSING, STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
and
THE SCHOOL OF NURSING, CHEJU HALLA UNIVERSITY
REPUBLIC OF KOREA

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter MOU) between the School of Nursing, Stony Brook University, U.S.A. (hereinafter SBUSN) and the School of Nursing, Cheju Halla University, Republic of Korea (hereinafter CHUSN) outlines the main elements of mutual cooperation between the two parties.

I. Objectives

The purpose of this MOU is to summarize the basic elements of a collaborative agreement and the promotion of mutual exchange in the field of nursing between SBUSN and CHUSN. Upon signing this MOU, SBUSN and CHUSN will engage in constructive discussions and developmental activities in an attempt to establish the following programs:

1. Student Exchange Program (SEP)
2. Doctor of Nursing Practice Program (DNP)
3. Other collaborative programs

II. Details of the Exchange Programs

All cooperation between SBUSN and CHUSN will take place according to the laws of the United States of America and the Republic of Korea, and in accordance with the policies and procedures of Stony Brook University and Cheju Halla University. Details of the exchange programs to be agreed upon at a later date are outlined below.

1. Student Exchange Program (SEP)

- a. Students who have completed two years at CHUSN can apply to transfer to the SBUSN's Bachelor of Nursing Program. Students may be accepted on a case-by-case basis after evaluation of the CHUSN Nursing Curriculum, the student's academic standing at CHUSN, English competency, and other related admission criteria.
- b. Those students who are accepted after review will be transferred to the third year of the Bachelor of Nursing degree program at Stony Brook University.
- c. The specific number of students admitted to the program annually will be determined by SBUSN based upon overall enrollment goals of a particular year.
- d. No specific number of students will be stipulated in this MOU and no student will be guaranteed admission prior to application and review by SBUSN. All decisions regarding admission shall be in the sole discretion of SBUSN.

2. Doctor of Nursing Practice Program (DNP)

Faculty from CHUSN will be admitted into SBUSN's Doctor of Nursing Practice Program upon the recommendation of the Dean of SBUSN.

- a. Students may be accepted to this program once they meet the educational criteria necessary for DNP admission, as determined solely by SBUSN.
- b. Students will need to hold a nurse practitioner (or equivalent) graduate degree and have successfully completed the NCLEX exam prior to admission.
- c. Students may be accepted on a case-by-case basis after evaluation by the SBUSN Admission Committee.
- d. The specific number of students admitted to the program annually will be determined by SBUSN based upon overall enrollment goals of a particular year.

3. Other Cooperative Programs

- a. SBUSN and CHUSN will carry out collaborative research projects and jointly publish articles in academic journals.
- b. SBUSN and CHUSN will exchange structure and information related to clinical practice quality improvement and risk management in the field of nursing.


- c. SBUSN and CHUSN will encourage participation of both parties' faculty members in any international symposiums or forums hosted by either party for nursing professionals on the development and dissemination of knowledge related to clinical practice or other aspects of the field of nursing.
- d. Details of other cooperative programs will be further discussed and decided upon by mutual agreement.

III. Period


