

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK
STONY BROOK,
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
And
CHONGQING PROVINCE
PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

Chongqing Personnel Bureau, Chongqing province, China hereinafter referred to as Chongqing, and State University of New York at Stony Brook, United States of America, hereinafter referred to as Stony Brook, in recognition of their common interests in developing bilateral relations and convinced that cooperation contributes to cultural enrichment, scientific progress, and the consolidation of friendship between countries, agree to establish the following Agreement of Cooperation.

I

This agreement will promote activities in the following areas:

- Short term instructional and cultural programs
- Professional and continuing education programs
- Personnel exchange program, including colloquia and symposia

II

1. Specific mechanisms for the implementation of particular cooperative and collaborative activities shall be established and described in writing by the responsible authority of each partner prior to the initiation of any particular program or activity.

III


1. All activities developed under the auspices of this Agreement will comply with the procedures, policies, and practices, of each partner as well as the law and regulations of the host, including applicable portions of the U.S. Export Controls Act.
2. Both partners acknowledge that the visits from one partner to the other shall be subject to the entry and visa regulations of the United States of America and, shall comply with the regulations and policies of Chongqing and Stony Brook.

IV


1. This Agreement is established for a period of five years, effective on the date of signing.
2. In order to enhance the efficacy of their cooperative activities, Chongqing and Stony Brook agree that it shall be possible to introduce changes and additions to the Agreement by means of mutually agreed upon additional written clauses.
3. At the end of each five-year period, this Agreement will be automatically renewed by mutual agreement for an additional five year period, unless Stony Brook or Chongqing provide written notification of a decision of non-renewal prior to the expiration date. A minimum period of six months notice will be required from either party wishing to terminate the Agreement. In the event of termination, all commitments to students participating in the program will be honored by relevant parties.
4. Both parties agree that Beijing Future-Land Information Consulting Co., Ltd. Will coordinate and execute cooperative programs based upon this agreement.
