

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
Between
EWHA WOMANS UNIVERSITY
KOREA
and
STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY, STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Ewha Womans University, Korea, hereinafter referred to as Ewha Womans University and Stony Brook University, State University of New York, hereinafter referred to as Stony Brook, in recognition of their common interests in developing bilateral relations and convinced that cooperation between universities contributes to cultural enrichment, scientific progress, and the consolidation of friendship between countries, agree to establish the following Agreement of Cooperation.

I

This Agreement of Cooperation will promote activities in the following principal areas:*

- Joint Academic Programs.
- Exchange of students.
- Intensive English Instruction.
- Exchange of faculty and academic staff.
- Collaborative research, instructional and cultural programs, including publication activities of mutual interest, exchange of bibliographic materials and, as appropriate, shared access to information networks.

II

1. Specific mechanisms for the implementation of particular cooperative and collaborative activities shall be established and described in corresponding Appendices to this Agreement.

III

1. All activities developed under the auspices of this Agreement will respect and conform to the corresponding norms, traditions and regulations of each University.
2. Both universities acknowledge that the visit by faculty and students from one university to the other shall be subject to the entry and visa regulations of the United States of America and Korea, and shall comply with the regulations and policies of Stony Brook and Ewha Womans Universities.


*A separate Appendix will be required.

IV


1. This Agreement is established for a period of five years, effective on the date of signing.
2. In order to enhance the efficacy of their cooperative activities, Ewha Womans University and Stony Brook agree that it shall be possible to introduce changes and additions to this Cooperative Agreement by means of mutually agreed upon additional written clauses.
3. At the end of each five-year period, this Agreement will be automatically renewed by mutual agreement for an additional five years, unless Ewha Womans University or Stony Brook provides written notification of a decision to terminate prior to the expiration date. A minimum period of six months notice will be required from either party wishing to terminate the agreement. In the event of termination, all commitments to students participating in the program will be honored by relevant parties.

STUDENT EXCHANGE APPENDIX
to the
AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION
between
THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK
and
EWHA WOMANS UNIVERSITY


In accordance with Section II of the Agreement of Cooperation, the following mechanisms designed to encourage and facilitate the exchange of students are hereby established:


1. Students are to be exchanged for one full academic year or for one semester.
2. The number of students to be exchanged each year shall be determined by mutual consent no later than February 1 of the preceding academic year. Ewha and SBU agree to achieve full reciprocity for the student exchange within three years. This balance may be achieved by an exchange of an equal number of students or other academic exchanges.
3. Initial selection of students will take place at the home institution; however, the host institution reserves the right to deny admission to any student not meeting its general admission criteria.
4. Student dossiers should be received at the host institution no later than March 15 for fall admissions and October 15 for spring admissions.
5. Each host university shall assist incoming students in arranging accommodation. Students shall be responsible for their own housing and meal costs.
6. Admitted students shall be responsible for normal and customary tuition, orientation, housing and meal costs. Where reciprocity exists, the host university shall waive tuition costs for incoming students.
7. Exchange students shall be required to enroll in the mandatory SBU insurance program and shall be responsible for all deductible costs related to health care services.
8. Students must be enrolled in a full-time course load at the host university for the duration of the program and in accordance with the student's degree program.
9. Students shall be free to choose courses from the full range of courses available at the host university, provided they satisfy course prerequisites.
10. Students shall comply with all rules and regulations of the host university, including relevant academic standing and conduct requirements.
11. Students who participate in the exchange program will not be degree candidates at the

host
university.

12. On the request of the student, at the end of a student's program overseas, the host university shall send to the home institution an official record of coursework completed at the host university.
13. Each university shall assess the academic work completed at the other university and shall award credit to its students in accordance with its own academic policies and regulations. Neither university shall be liable for the acts of the other or for the acts of students participating in this exchange.
14. The host university shall assist incoming students to obtain visas and other documents required for entry to the host country. To comply with host country regulations, exchange students shall be required to provide a guarantee that they have financial resources sufficient to meet all expenses.
15. This Appendix shall be in effect for the same period as the Agreement of Cooperation and may be adjusted in writing upon mutual agreement of the two parties. For matters not covered in Appendix, the universities shall consult their Agreement of Cooperation.
