

## Letter of Understanding

Seoul, Korea

In recognition of the common interests shared by The State University of New York at Stony Brook(SUSB) and Seoul National University(SNU), the two Universities understand that each party will follow due procedures to develop academic exchange and cooperation in teaching and research in the furtherance of the advancement and dissemination of learning.

The contents of the proposed agreement would, in general, include the following conditions:


1. To encourage, and use their best endeavours to effect, visits from one university to the other by members of academic staff for the purpose of participating in teaching and research programs.
2. To admit qualified students of one university to the undergraduate and postgraduate degree and diploma courses of the other.
3. To encourage the exchange of scientific materials, publications and information.
4. To prepare, as necessary, a working program detailing specific forms and contents of cooperation.


This Letter of Understanding shall be superseded by a prospective Agreement of Cooperation on the date when the latter comes into effect, as determined by mutual understanding of the parties concerned.

AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION

between

THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK, U.S.A.

and

SEOUL NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

---

In recognition of the common interests shared by the State University of New York at Stony Brook (SUSB) and Seoul National University (SNU), the objective of this AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION is to enhance scholarly interaction between the two Universities. This shall be done through the development of systematic exchange opportunities for faculty and professional staff, so that they may participate in instruction and research, and so that students may enhance their studies and/or research.

To develop these activities, the following conditions will be established:

1

A Director of SUSB/SNU Exchange Program shall be appointed by the President of each institution, respectively, for the coordination and administration of the Program.

2

Through the respective Coordinators of the Program, the institutions will exchange information about their opportunities and specific needs for the period designated, along with an identification of the resources which will be available at each campus in the form of stipends to support students, faculty and

staff. If the costs of the proposed activities exceed the anticipated departmental or institutional resources for the Program, the coordinators shall attempt together to secure external support.

Contingent upon the availability of financial resources, both parties agree to invite faculty and staff to give lectures, to discuss academic and research planning, and to conduct collaborative research. Financial and housing arrangements will be made on an individual basis prior to arrival. Salaries of faculty and staff shall be the responsibility of the home institution, unless specifically arranged otherwise.

The present agreement is for a period of five years commencing January 1st, 1991. The agreement may be extended for further periods with the mutual consent of both parties. Either party may discontinue the present agreement, provided they give at least a six month notice.

The present agreement may be supplemented by addenda discussing further particulars of the exchange program, as determined by mutual consent of the contracting parties.
