


STUDENT EXCHANGE APPENDIX
to the
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
between
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK(SUNY-SB)
and
KOREA ADVANCED INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY(KAIST)

In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding between SUNY-SB and KAIST, the following principles designed to encourage and facilitate the student exchange are hereby established:


1. Students are to be exchanged for the following period:
 - full academic year and/or spring or fall semester only
2. The number of students to be exchanged each year will be two. The universities agree to achieve full reciprocity, that is, to exchange an equal number of students by the end of this Memorandum period
3. Initial selection of students will take place at the home university; however, the host university reserves the right to deny admission to any student not meeting its general admission criteria.
4. Student dossiers should be received at the host university no later than May 30 for fall semester and November 15 for spring semester for State University of New York at Stony Brook and 10 December for first semester and 31 May for second semester for KAIST.
5. Each host university will do its utmost to secure accommodations for incoming students provided the students meet all requirements and deadlines. Students will be responsible for their own housing costs.
6. The host university will waive tuition fees for the incoming exchange students and will inform them in a timely fashion concerning fees and expenses for which the student will be responsible.
7. Students shall be responsible for obtaining health insurance coverage to the satisfaction of the host university.
8. Students must be enrolled in a full-time course load at the host university for the duration of the program. At Stony Brook, this equals a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester. At KAIST this equals a minimum of 9 credit hours per semester.
9. Students will be free to choose courses from the full range of courses available at the host university, provided they satisfy course prerequisites and space is available.
10. The participating students will not be degree candidates at the host university.

11. Both parties must approve any extension of stay beyond the original length determined. A student who wishes to apply for degree status must reapply to the host university and follow the appropriate application procedures of the host university.
12. At the end of a student's program overseas, each host university will send an official record of coursework completed at the host university to the home university.
13. Each home university will assess academic work completed at the host university and will award credit to its students in accordance with its own academic policies and regulations.
14. This Appendix shall be in effect for the same period as the Memorandum of Understanding and may be adjusted in writing upon mutual agreement of the two universities. For matters not covered in the Appendix, both universities shall consult the Memorandum of Understanding.




