**UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT**

**between**

**UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN - SHANGHAI JIAO TONG UNIVERSITY**

**JOINT INSTITUTE**

**and**

**STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT STONY BROOK**

The University of Michigan - Shanghai Jiao Tong University Joint Institute, Shanghai Jiao Tong University, the People's Republic of China, hereinafter referred to as JI, and the State University of New York at Stony Brook, the United States of America, hereinafter referred to as SBU, agree to establish the following mechanisms designed to encourage and facilitate the exchange of students between JI and SBU are hereby established:


1. Students are to be exchanged for one full academic year or for one semester.
2. The number of students to be exchanged each year shall be determined by mutual consent no later than February 1 of the preceding academic year. JI and SBU agree to achieve full reciprocity for the student exchange within three years. This balance may be achieved by an exchange of an equal number of students or other academic exchanges including summer schools.
3. Study Abroad Conditions
  - I) In the event that there is an imbalance in the number of students wishing to exchange, the parties may agree to establish a Study Abroad program additional to the above student exchange program for students from the home institution to study at the host institution.
  - II) Visiting students enrolled in such a Study Abroad program will be subject to all of the exchange conditions listed within this agreement with the exception of tuition waivers.
  - III) Payment of fees for Study Abroad students undertaking studies at the host institution will be in accordance with the fee collection procedures of the host institution.
4. Initial selection of students will take place at the home institution; however, the host institution reserves the right to deny admission to any student not meeting its general admission criteria.
5. Student dossiers should be received at the host institution no later than March 30 for fall admissions and October 15 for spring admissions.

6. Each host institution shall assist incoming students in arranging accommodation. Students shall be responsible for their own housing and meal costs.
7. Admitted students shall be responsible for tuition, orientation, housing and meal costs. Where reciprocity exists, the host institution shall waive tuition costs for incoming students.
8. Students shall be required to enroll in the mandatory health insurance program of the host institution and shall be responsible for all deductible costs related to health care services.
9. Students must be enrolled in a full-time course load at the host institution for the duration of the program and in accordance with the student's degree program.
10. Students shall be free to choose courses from the full range of courses available at the host institution, provided they satisfy course prerequisites and if required, departmental consent.
11. Students shall comply with all rules and regulations of the host institution, including relevant academic standing and conduct requirements.
12. On the request of the student, at the end of a student's program overseas, the host institution shall send to the home institution an official record of coursework completed at the host institution.
13. Each institution shall assess the academic work completed at the other institution and shall award credit to its students in accordance with its own academic policies and regulations. Neither institution shall be liable for the acts of the other or for the acts of students participating in this exchange.
14. The host institution shall assist incoming students to obtain visas and other documents required for entry to the host country. To comply with host country regulations, students shall be required to provide a guarantee that they have financial resources sufficient to meet all expenses.
15. This Agreement is established for a period of five years, effective on the date of the last signatory. At the end of each five-year period, it will be automatically renewed by mutual agreement for an additional five years, unless JI or SBU provide written notification of a decision of non-renewal prior to the expiration date. A minimum period of six months notice will be required from either party wishing to terminate the Agreement. In the event of termination, all commitments to students participating in the program will be honored by relevant parties.


